CalWORKs Program Overview

CalWORKs is a welfare program that gives cash aid and services to eligible needy California families. If a family has little or no cash and needs housing, food, utilities, clothing or medical care, they may be eligible to receive immediate short-term help. Families that apply and qualify for ongoing assistance receive money each month to help pay for housing, food and other necessary expenses.

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What is CalWORKs?

- CalWORKs provides temporary financial assistance to families with minor children who have income and property below State maximum limits for their family size.
- CalWORKs provides employment- focused services through Greater Avenues for Independence (GAIN) to families with minor children
- Families that apply and qualify for CalWORKs receive money each month to help pay for housing, food and other necessary expenses.
- The amount of a family's monthly cash assistance depends on a number of factors, including income (if any) the number of people who are eligible, and the special needs of any of those family members.
- Applicants may apply for an Immediate Need if an urgent matter exists, if eligible may receive up to \$200.
- Applicants may also apply for Homeless Assistance if the family lacks a permanent place to live.

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Basic Eligibility Requirements

- The family's net monthly income (after applicable disregards) must be less than the Maximum Aid Payment (MAP) for family size. For example, the MAP for a family of three is currently \$714 (effective October 1, 2016).
- At least one parent must be unemployed, deceased, disabled or absent.
- The principle wage earner in a two-parent family must not be employed more than 100 hours a month at the time of application.
- Children must live with a parent or relative caregiver.
- Aided family members must be a U.S. Citizen or eligible legal immigrant.
- Cash on hand is limited to \$2,250. If one member of the aided/to be aided household is 60 years or older, the limit is \$3,500. Property and/or resources that are not counted towards property limit include the home in which the family lives, furniture, appliances, tools needed for employment, and one car, with a value up to \$9,500.



Basic Eligibility Requirements (continue)

- Application process can take up to 30 calendar days.
- Required documents include, but are not limited to:
 - ✓ CA Residency (CA ID or CA DL)
 - ✓ Birth Certificates
 - ✓ Pregnancy verification (if applicable)
 - ✓ Immigration status (Resident Alien Card)
 - ✓ Income (earn or unearned)
 - ✓ Resources (bank account(s), house(s), vehicle(s), life insurance policies, retirement accounts)
 - ✓ Immunizations (all children under age 6)

(1) To receive the MAP (higher) exemption the family must have an eligible child and each adult relative caretaker must receive one of the following benefits: SSI, IHSS, SDI, Temporary Workers' Comp, Temporary Disability, or is a non-needy/non-parent caretaker relative.



CalWORKs Homeless Assistance (HA) - State Program: Available once every 12 months. A family may also be able to get this assistance more than once in 12 months, if they meet an exception.

- Temporary HA Provides homeless families with up to 16 consecutive calendar days of shelter payments so families can stay at a hotel, motel, or paid shelter.
- Permanent HA Provides homeless families with assistance to pay for security deposit costs required by the landlord and utility turn-on fees needed to secure permanent housing.
- Permanent HA Arrearages Provides families who are at-risk of homelessness with assistance to pay for up to two months of past due rent to prevent eviction.

HA benefits based on an exception are available once at any point during the 12-month period. Exceptions include when homelessness is the result of: domestic violence, uninhabitability of the residence, a medically verified physical or mental illness, or a State or federally declared natural disaster.



County Supplemental Homeless Assistance Programs:

- Temporary Homeless Assistance Program (THAP)+14 Supplements the State's Temporary HA by providing an additional 14 days of temporary shelter payments so homeless families can stay at a hotel, motel, or paid shelter.
- Moving Assistance Provides families who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness with assistance to pay security deposit costs, truck rental, utility turn-on fees, and refrigerator and/or stove.
- Emergency Assistance to Prevent Eviction Provides families who are at-risk of homelessness with assistance to pay for up to \$3,000 to help pay for up to two months of past due arrears when facing eviction.
- 4-Month Rental Assistance Provides up to four consecutive months of rental subsidy payments to help families stabilize after being homeless or at-risk of homelessness. If the CalWORKs Welfare-to-Work family is participating in the GAIN Family Stabilization Program, the family may receive up to eight consecutive months of rental subsidy payments.



Time Limits

- Currently, most adults can only receive 48 months of cash aid. There is no time limit on cash aid for children.
- Some exemptions apply such as:
 - Victims of domestic violence; or
 - Those deemed to be permanently or temporarily disabled.



Where and How to Apply

- There are 24 CalWORKs District Offices throughout Los Angeles County in which a family can apply for aid.
- The application can be done in person or on-line via Your Benefits Now link on the dpss.lacounty.gov webpage.
- The Department has a 'No Wrong Door' policy that allows families to apply at any office. The case will be transferred to the appropriate office based on the case address.
